

## Select Bibliography

This list of books and articles is intended as a brief guide for students and theatre designers embarking on sixteenth- and early seventeenth-century projects. Some of the items listed are foreign publications or are now out of print but may be borrowed through the National Central Library Service in Britain. *Costume*, the journal of the Costume Society (publications enquiries c/o Miss Helen Wood, Birtle Edge House, Bury, Lancashire BL9 6UW), *Dress*, the journal of the Costume Society of America (c/o The Costume Institute, The Metropolitan Museum, New York) and *Waffen-und Kostümkunde*, the journal of the Armour and Costume Society founded in Germany in 1896 (c/o Kunstbibliothek, Jebenstrasse 2, D-1000 Berlin 12), which contain many well-illustrated articles, are also available in some art college and polytechnic libraries. The last-named journal publishes articles in English as well as German. Titles marked with a dagger mention, or discuss fully, one or more of the items of clothing in this book.

of paintings and engravings showing costume.

LEVY-PISISTKY, R. *Storia del Costume in Italia*. Vol. 3, *Il Cinquecento*. Il Seicento. Istituto Editoriale Italiano, Milan, 1966. Covers from c1500 to 1690. Numerous monochrome and colour plates.

LINTHICUM, M.C. *Costume in the Drama of Shakespeare and his Contemporaries*. Oxford, 1936, reprinted New York, 1963. Monochrome plates. A standard work with useful chapters on colours and textiles used for clothing during the sixteenth and early seventeenth centuries, with principal works cited.

MORSE, H.K. *Elizabethan Pageantry: a pictorial survey of costume and its commentators from 1560–1620*. Studio, 1934, reprinted 1976. Monochrome plates and useful descriptions of costume from contemporary sources.

NEWTON, S.M. *Renaissance Theatre Costume*. Andre Deutsch, 1973. Monochrome plates. A discussion of the sense of historic past in the sixteenth- and sixteenth-century theatre costume.

NIENHOLDT, K. *Kostüme des 16. und 17. Jahrhunderts*. Klinkhardt & Biermann, Braunschweig, 1962. 16 monochrome and 4 colour plates of surviving examples of costume in Europe. Text in German.

PETRASCHECK-HEIM, I. *Die Meisterstückbücher des Schneiderhandwerkes in Innsbruck*. Sonderdruck aus Veröffentlichungen des Museums Ferdinandeum, Innsbruck, 1970. An account of the master tailors of Innsbruck and their pattern books from the sixteenth to eighteenth centuries, with numerous cutting diagrams. Text in German.

PROVINCIAAL MUSEUM STERCKHOOF, ANTWERP. *De Mode in Rubens' Tijd*. Antwerp, 1971. Monochrome plates. Catalogue of exhibition of fashions in the time of Rubens, with examples of early seventeenth-century costume and accessories.

PYLKANEN, K. *Saatyläispuksi Suomessa Vanhemmalla Aaasajalla, 1550–1620*. Helsinki, 1955. Monochrome plates. The costume of the nobility, clergy and burghers in the earlier Vasa period, 1550–1620. Text in Finnish with English summary.

READER, R. *The Dominance of Spain 1550–1600*. Costume of the Western World Series, Harrap, 1951. Monochrome and colour plates of engravings and portraits showing Spanish fashion.

REYNOLDS, G. *Elizabethan and Jacobean, 1558–1625*. Costume of the Western World Series, Harrap, 1951. Monochrome and colour plates of English portraits.

STAATLICHE KUNSTSAMMLUNGEN, DRESDEN. *Historische Prunkkleidung*. Dresden, 1963. Catalogue of costumes in the Dresden State Museum, c1550 to the early eighteenth century.

Catalogue of costumes from the tombs of the Electors Palatine of the Wittelsbach line at Lauiingen on the Danube. Includes a catalogue of the jewellery by Irmtraud Himelhaber. All items are now in the Bayerisches Nationalmuseum, Munich.

THIENEN, F. VAN. *The Great Age of Holland, 1600–50*. Costume of the Western World Series, Harrap, 1957. Monochrome and colour plates of engravings and paintings showing Dutch costume.

VICTORIA AND ALBERT MUSEUM. *Princely Magnificence*. Debreit's Peagee, 1980. Numerous colour and monochrome plates. Catalogue of Court jewels of the Renaissance 1500–1630. ed. Anna Somers Cocks.

WALTHER, K. *Das Hausbuch der Familie Melem. Ein Trachtenbuch des Frankfurter Patriziats aus dem 16. Jahrhundert*. Verlag für Wissenschaftliche Literatur, Frankfurt, 1968. Numerous colour plates. Shows clothes worn by members of the Melem family in the

Illustrated catalogue raisonné in 26 parts of the work of Peter Paul Rubens. *The Costume Book*, a sketchbook by Rubens in the British Museum, contains drawings of figures in late fourteenth- and fifteenth-century Flemish and Burgundian Court fashions, early sixteenth-century German costume and late sixteenth-century Turkish, Persian and Arabic dress. Many are copies after earlier models.
