Slyšel jsem o tom, že finančními zdroji takových studií jsou většinou vládní úřady, které mají v protidrogovém boji své zájmy, připouštějí jen negativně zaměřené výzkumy. Vzhledem k tomu, že nejhorší následky žvýkání katy jsou takové, že mohou přispět k psychickému zhroucení asi tak šesti lidí z celého Spojeného království, a mohou tedy být potenciálně zneužitelnou látkou, takovéto studie vlastně jen podtrhují bezpečnost a zdůrazňují blahodárné účinky rostliny.)
