

BIBLIOGRAFIE

Tento příběh přibližuje čtenáři také více než sto osobních výpovědí příslušníků československé legie, které poprvé přeložil do angličtiny Ivo Řezníček, PhD. Celkem 460 takových vyprávění je shromážděno v pětisvazkovém sborníku *Cestami odboje: Jak žily a kudy táhly čs. legie* (v angl. překladu *The Road to Resistance: How the Czech Legion Lived and Fought*), který vyšel v Praze v letech 1926–1929. Na základě pečlivého výběru bylo 107 z těchto výpovědí očitých svědků přeloženo do angličtiny a právě ty jsou nejrelevantnějším zdrojem použitým v této knize. Po roce 1939, během nacistického a později komunistického režimu, byl uvedený sborník zakázán.
