Bibliography

Except for a very small number of direct mentions of specific works and authors, there are no conventional footnote references in this text. The arguments are too general, and often too obviously summaries of very well-known positions taken by whole schools of social thought, to warrant a cumbersome scholarly apparatus. Nevertheless, I think it important to point out that the ideas I have expressed are summations of many other works. The ones listed below are those that I have already cited and also those I have found most useful over the past thirty years of reading and thinking about social change.
