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A. Index of Mythological and Historical Persons, Subjects, and Place Names

A simple guide to pronunciation follows most words in this index. The long vowels are to be pronounced as follows: ā (cape), ē (bee), ī (ice), ō (boat), and ū (too). Syllabification is marked by a prime (') and a hyphen (-). Syllables which precede the prime are stressed.

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
