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In the Chapter we provide a brief introduction to our book. We discuss the following themes which run throughout the entire book: (a) depressive disorders and comorbidity: assessment and diagnosis, theory and research, diagnostic criteria, leading health consequences, management, coping, illness burden and rehabilitation, and future directions. A number of themes will be repeated, including the increasingly broad scope of depressive disorders, comorbidity, and the implications for theory, research, and practice—very importantly as we consider one typical comorbidity versus another. For example, the comorbidity of depression and generalized anxiety disorder has very different implications than the comorbidity of depression and alcohol use. The last section of the book is devoted to the comorbidity of depression and anxiety, which again has different implications than the comorbidity of depression and alcohol use. The last section of the book, the Index, highlights some of the themes and issues, but the remarkable breadth and depth of depressive comorbidity research shows us we consider all of the Chapter's content.
