Betrayal, sorcery and one dazzling aria after the next... Ovid's Queen Niobe of Thebes, who turns to stone when her children are slain by the gods as punishment for her arrogance and pride, is the subject of this forgotten 1688 masterpiece. The Italian composer-priest Agostino Steffani languished in obscurity until the opera was rediscovered recently; the Boston Early Music Festival give its world-premiere studio recording with Karina Gauvin in the psychologically complex title role, and countertenor Philippe Jaroussky singing "powerfully and sweetly" (The New York Times) as Niobe's busband Anfione, driven to suicide in the face of family tragedy.
