Introduction

General

This book of exercises was written to accompany Michael Swan's *Basic English Usage*, but it can also be used on its own. It provides practice and revision material on over 200 important points of usage, grammar and lexis. It is intended for students of English from lower intermediate level upwards and is suitable both for use in class and for self study.

Exercises

The 230 exercises are varied in approach to suit the topic and the needs of the user. With few exceptions, the exercises are contextualized. Many exercises make use of picture cues. Several exercises are controlled, i.e. they have a limited number of possible answers. Others are open-ended, i.e. they offer freer communicative practice. Here the student is guided towards expressing wishes, preferences, opinions, etc within the framework of a specific language item. The student relates to and draws on his personal situation, own background and experience.

Organization

The language points treated are dealt with alphabetically, as in *Basic English Usage*. In the vast majority of cases, each exercise deals with one *BEU* point only. This makes the exercise book very easy to use together with *Basic English Usage*. All exercises are cross-referenced to the corresponding sections of *Basic English Usage* and most have at least one example.

Key

There is a full Key for students working on their own. Where the exercise is open-ended, suggestions are made or examples of possible answers are given.
