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As it turned out, her support led to innumerable breakfasts among the four of us discussing the organisation of the book, the different chapters we might include and who would take responsibility for what. The typescript was eventually completed, a little more slowly than we had hoped. We would probably all admit that there were times when writing a book with three other authors seemed onnecessarily onerous, far harder than writing a single-authored volume. But none of us really felt this way for long. The four of us have worked very well together, proving supportive and positive, even when being critical.
