A core text for all students of social anthropology, **Ethnicity and Nationalism** provides a broad overview of the key theoretical dimensions and problems of this controversial subject. In the process, Eriksen also demonstrates that a focus on ethnicity and nationalism provides an excellent starting point for an investigation of key problems in contemporary social theory.
