**Natalia B. Stambulova, PhD**, is a professor of Sport and Exercise Psychology in the School of Social and Health Sciences at Loughborough University, Leicestershire, UK. She has worked for three decades as a teacher, researcher and practitioner, specialising in the area of career development and transition. Her research interests include the role of the coach in the development of athletes' careers, with an emphasis on athletes' career transitions and crises. Her particular specialisation in applied work is assisting athletes and coaches to deal with various career/life-style issues, especially for competitive athletes.

**Tatiana V. Ryba** was a keynote speaker at the European Congress of Sport Psychology (2007) and was a member of the ISSP Managing Council (Psychology in 2007) and has been a member of the ISSP since 2001 and is vice-president since 2009. In 2004, she received the Distinguished Lifetime Achievement Award from the Applied Sport Psychology.

**Tatiana V. Ryba** is an Associate Professor of Sport Psychology at Aarhus University, Denmark. She holds a PhD in Sport Studies with an emphasis on sport psychology and performance. Her current research focuses on issues of transition, identity, performance, career transitions and cultural adaptation in and through sport. She is the co-editor, with Robert J. Schinke and Graham T. Williams, of the book *Career Development in Sport Psychology* (2010) and has guest-edited a Special Issue of the *International Journal of Sport and Exercise Psychology* (2009) and is a member of the editorial board of *International Journal of Sport and Exercise Psychology*. She is also serving on the managing council of the International Society of Sport Psychology (ISSP). She is the current chair of the Cultural Issues in Applied Sport Psychology Committee of the Association for the Applied Sport Psychology (AASP). For her innovative work in sport psychology, Dr Ryba received the ISSP Lifetime Achievement Award in 2009.
