am thrilled to couple these brilliant, youthful works by two giants of the 20th century — born the same year in the same country (as the map of Europe was drawn then) — who admired each other and even performed together. The concerto reveals a tender, loving side of the young Hungarian composer, while the Romanian violin prodigy created an ambitious work elevating the string octet to a higher plane. It meant the world to me to gather some truly great and very dear colleagues of mine for this recording **v Vide Frang**
