About the editors

Hernán Vera is a Professor of Sociology at Vassar College where she has taught and conducted research positions in International Studies (1992–2001), International Studies (2007–2010), and International Studies (2012–2015). She served the university as the Director of Research (2007–2008) and as Director of the Vassar Committee (2012–2013). She has written four books and editorials on global racism and inequality, including *The Great Game* (1997) and *White Racism* (2009). She is the author of seven edited volumes, fifteen book reviews, and political articles, including "African Americans Global Report: War and Democracy," and "Charting the Global Roots to and Anti-Racism: From Everyday Life to Global Sociology." Her new interest area is environmental degradation, the work of indigenous and non-indigenous people, issues of climate change and climate justice, and green discourse and eco-justice issues. She has received grants from the Ford Foundation, The Kroc Institute at the University of Notre Dame, the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, the National Science Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the National Science Foundation.

Joe R. Feagin is a University Professor and University Distinguished Professor at Texas A&M University. His research on racism, relevant and discredited laws, he has published many scholarly books and hundreds of scholarly articles in their research areas. Among his books are *Race and Racism* (Rowman, 1989), *Two-Faced Racism* (Rowman, 2001), and *A People's History: The White Racist Frame* (2nd ed., Routledge, 2011); *Race Against the Wind* (Rowman, 2012); *White Power: The New Government* (Rowman, 2012); *Leaders Playing Racism* (Rowman, 2014, with J. Oates); *The Myth of the Model Minority* (2nd ed., Rowman, 2015); and *Color Liberation Sociology* (Rowman, Plymouth, 2015, with H. Vera, L. Dickey, and Ross Black); *Post-White America* (Rowman, 2016). He has served as Scholar-in-Residence at the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights and is the recipient of the American Association for Attainmentive Action's Distinguished Lifetime Achievement Award and the American Sociological Association's W. E. B. DuBois Award for Distinguished Scholarship. Awarded the 1999–2000 president of the American Sociological Association.
