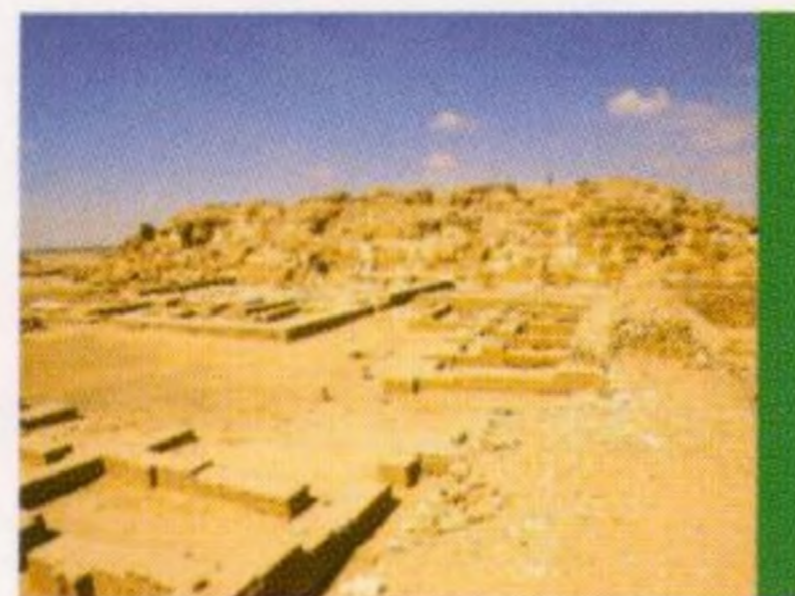


# Pyramid Fields of Ancient Egypt

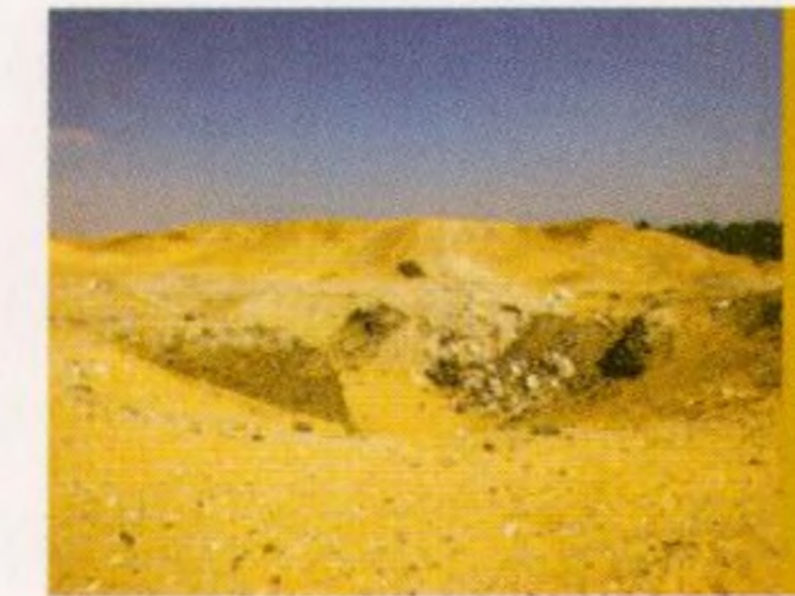
## ● Abu Rawash

A. Ćwiek \_\_\_\_\_ 16  
A necropolis dominated by the pyramid of Djedefra and featuring several Old Kingdom cemeteries and perhaps also the pyramid of Huni.



## ● Mazghuna

M. Bárta \_\_\_\_\_ 142  
Next to Zawiyet el-Aryan, another poorly explored royal cemetery with the pyramids of Sobeknofru and Amenemhat IV.



## ● Giza

M. Lehner \_\_\_\_\_ 24  
One of the most impressive necropoleis of the Old Kingdom with dozens of non-royal tombs and with some of the largest pyramids ever built in history – the Fourth Dynasty complexes of Khufu, Khafra and Menkaura.



## ● Meidum

P. Jánosí \_\_\_\_\_ 146  
This is the cemetery where the history of the Fourth Dynasty begins. It is dominated by a single pyramid, that of Snofru, with a huge cemetery of large mastabas of several members of his family.



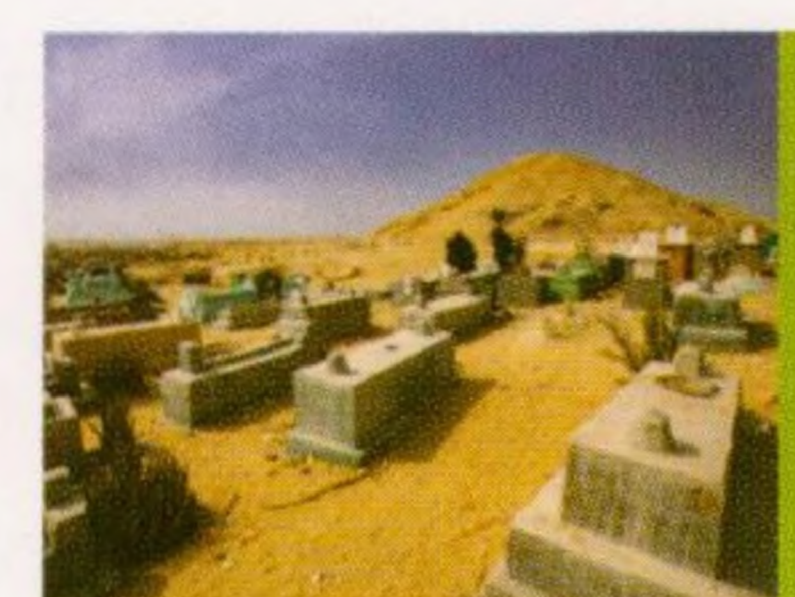
## ● Zawiyet el-Aryan

M. Verner \_\_\_\_\_ 54  
One of the least understood pyramid sites of the Old Kingdom with two poorly explored royal monuments.



## ● Lisht

D. Arnold – A. Oppenheim \_\_\_\_\_ 152  
This is a site of key importance for the beginning of the Twelfth Dynasty, as it contains the pyramid complexes of Amenemhat I and Senusret I.



## ● Abu Ghurab

M. Nuzzolo \_\_\_\_\_ 60  
A site north of the Abusir necropolis with so far two discovered sun-temple complexes belonging to Userkaf and Nyusera of the Fifth Dynasty.



## ● El-Lahun

P. Jánosí \_\_\_\_\_ 168  
Another Middle Kingdom cemetery with the complex of Senusret II, many largely unexplored cemeteries and a historically unique city.



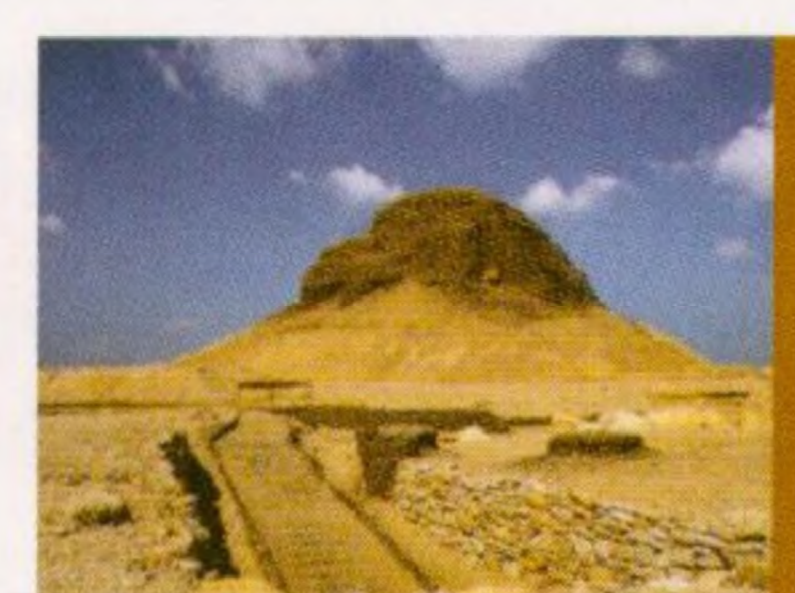
## ● Abusir

M. Bárta \_\_\_\_\_ 70  
Principal pyramid necropolis of the Fifth Dynasty with the pyramid complexes of Sahura, Neferirkara, Raneferef and Nyusera and with several cemeteries, in the south merging with Saqqara.



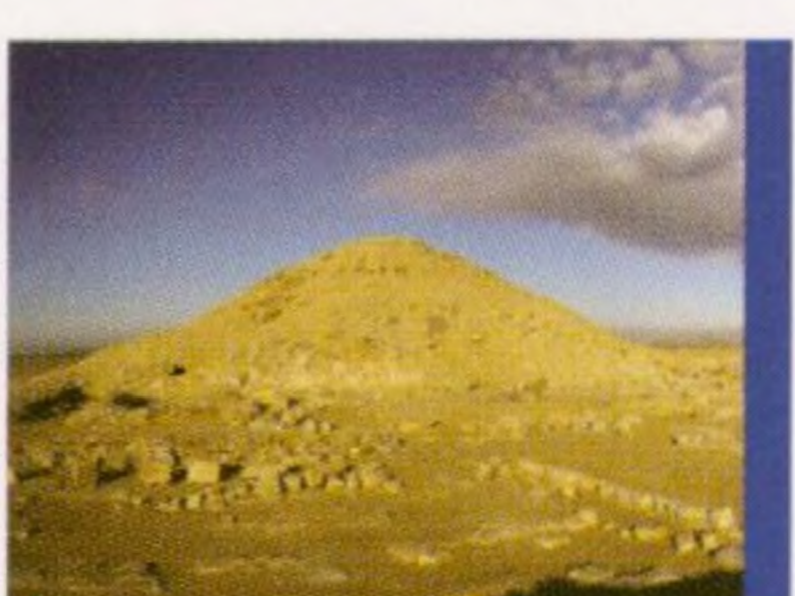
## ● Hawara

P. Jánosí \_\_\_\_\_ 176  
One more spectacular site of the Middle Kingdom with the pyramid complex of Amenemhat III and the famous Labyrinth.



## ● Saqqara

M. Bárta – V. Dulíková – M. Megahed \_\_\_\_\_ 88  
Most important Memphite cemetery of the whole third millennium BC, featuring the first stone-built complex of King Djoser, and many Early Dynastic and Old Kingdom monuments.



## ● Abydos

J. Wegner \_\_\_\_\_ 184  
This is one of the most famous cemeteries of ancient Egypt since the Predynastic Period which also features the final resting place of Senusret III.



## ● Dahshur

A. Oppenheim – D. Arnold – S. J. Seidlmayer \_\_\_\_\_ 122  
Principal cemetery with two complexes and pyramids of the founder of the Fourth Dynasty Snofru and several Middle Kingdom royal monuments.



## ● Small pyramids

R. Bussmann \_\_\_\_\_ 192  
A set of seven small pyramids of the early Old Kingdom represent another enigma of the history of third millennium BC Egypt.
