
In this collection of essays, Kundera examines the work of such important and diverse figures as Rabelais, Cervantes, Sterne, Diderot, Flaubert, Tolstoy, and Musil. He is especially penetrating on Hermann Broch, and his exploration of the world of Kafka's novels vividly reveals the comic terror of Kafka's bureaucratised universe. Kundera's discussion of his own work includes his views on the role of historical events in fiction, the meaning of action, and the creation of character in the post-psychological novel.

The Scottish born actor Graeme Malcolm was brought up in London where he found his talent at oration at a young age. Malcolm is an accomplished actor on stage and screen, as well as being a popular narrator. He has made Broadway appearances in plays such as *Equus*, *The Real Thing* and the musicals *Aida* and *The King and I*. Graeme's most recent television appearance was in *Boardwalk Empire* and much of his career has been devoted to the recording of audiobooks.
