

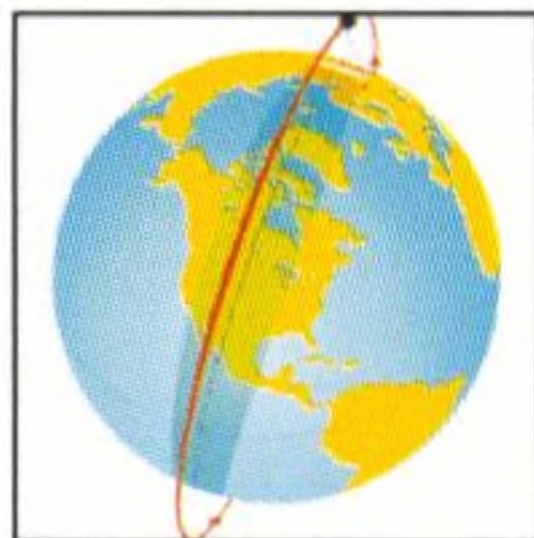

The maps are presented by continent, beginning with Europe. Each section starts with a double page spread featuring the continent in question, followed by larger scale maps of individual countries.



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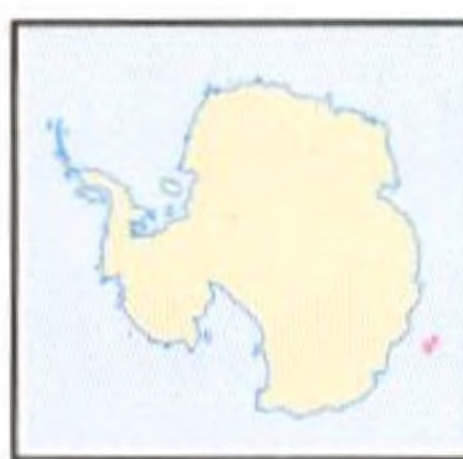
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
