Each hand moves in contrary motion like the two wings of a butterfly. Then imagine them flying in slow motion.

2. Balestrand Page 6

This is a beautiful village surrounded by peaceful fjords. The duet version can be downloaded from the Musica Ferrum website.

3. Crystal Dew Page 8

The morning dew glisten like jewels on the grass as the sun rises.

4. The Coral Reef
Page 10

Play this as smoothly as possible as you imagine swimming underwater with the fishes.

5. Bluebell Page 12

I was inspired to write this after a lovely walk in Wakehurst Place in West Sussex. Feel free to change the fingering to suit the size of your hands.

6. Shifting Shadows

Page 14

Watch out for a hemiola from bar 21 when the triple beat changes to a duple feel.

7. Lullaby Page 16

This was inspired by a photo of a friend holding his new-born daughter.

8. Echoes Page 18

Make the final section as dramatic as possible.

9. South Downs

Picture in your mind the majestic white cliffs of the Seven Sisters in East Sussex.

10. Tivoli Gardens Page 22

This amusement park in Copenhagen is one of the oldest in the world. It has a rickety wooden rollercoaster which is operated by hand. The broken chords depict the ups and downs of the giddy rides.

11. Somerset Clouds Page 24

I wrote this in the car while admiring some beautiful cloud formations in the Somerset countryside.

12. Afternoon Tea Page 26

Imagine having tea and scone on a sunny summer's day. The piece slowly builds up with each section.
